Anthony Allen – kennel Allenie



It was 1975 when a Labrador first entered the Allen household; my parents Jean and Geoff had decided it was time for a dog to be part of our family. A Labrador fitted the bill exactly, so Heidi joined the family and my journey with show dogs began.

Five years later my parents decided to look for another Labrador. After making numerous telephone calls and viewing several litters, they tracked down and they chose a very proud puppy who turned out to be the beginning of the Allenie kennel becoming Sh Ch Squire Harvey of Allenie. He had fantastic success, a Gundog Group winner and Best of Breed at Crufts in 1985.

Since those early successes there have been many other consistent Champions, CC and RCC winner including Sh Ch Allenie's Maverick (14 CC's) who was top winning Labrador in the UK in 2009 and UK, Am and Can Ch Salty Dog of Tampa Bay (23 CC's) who was top Labrador in 2012, number 2 Gundog and number 7 all breeds in the UK.

With my partner Richard, we also own English Springer Spaniels, Irish Setter and English Setters and have made up over 30 champions across the four breeds. These include the springer Sh Ch Trimere Talking Point of Allenie (27 CC's) who was top dog in the breed and was BOB at Crufts twice. The English Setter Sh Ch Quensha Little Jeanie (30 CC's) and the Irish Setters Sh Ch Bardonhill Please Don't Tease Quensha (21 CC's).

I first judged in 1990 and awarded my first set of CC's in the UK in 2006. I am now passed to award CC's in all Gundog breeds (FCI Group 7 and 8) and the Gundog Group.

I have had the pleasure of judging all over the world in countries including Denmark, France, Germany, Italy, Poland, Norway, Sweden, Switzerland, Australia and America. I am thrilled to be invited to judge dogs at Swedish Spaniel and Retriever Club Show at Ulriksdal, 2024 and very much looking forward to the day.

Richard Bott – kennel Quensha



I have been involved in the world of Pedigree Dogs and dog showing for 35 years this year. During my time I have been mainly involved in breeds within the Gundog Group and have bred/owned and campaigned dogs to Show Champion titles in Irish Setters, English Setters, Pointers, English Springer Spaniels, Welsh Springer Spaniels, Weimaraners and Labradors.

I have also co-owned dogs in the Working and Hound Groups and campaigned these to their titles. I total I have been fortunate to achieve Sh Ch/Ch status for 40 dogs in my career within dogs to date.

I am currently passed to awards CC's in 45 Breeds across the Gundog, Hound, Working, Pastoral and Terrier Groups, as well as the Gundog Group and also Best in Show at Championship Show Level.

I have judged in Scandinavia, Germany, Ireland, Australia, Netherlands and I am very much looking forward to my appointment in Sweden.

Angela Hackett - kennel Lindridge



Angela Hackett have been dedicated breeder of particoloured Cocker Spaniels for over forty-five years and during that time have bred at least fifteen UK Show Champions. Others that have travelled abroad have become champions of their country. Occasionally solid-coloured litters are born at kennel Lindridge.

Angela Hackett strives to breed for quality and type whilst temperament and health are of the utmost importance. The breeding stock are

health tested or awaiting results and their offspring are sold with confidence. It isn't only about the best-looking dog; the personalities too play an important role.

As for Angelas judging, she has been asked to travel to many parts of the world from Australia to Russia. In 2011 she had the honour to judge Cocker Dogs at Crufts. Angela judged the Swedish Cocker Spaniel Club's Specialities in 1994 and 2007 and look forward to return to the Sweden for the Club Show 2024 arranged by the Swedish Spaniel and Retriever Club.

David Shields – kennel Wilholme



I started showing Cocker Spaniels in 1971. Over the years had great success in the breed, breeding and showing numerous Show Champions and CC winners in the UK as well as breeding a number of top winners in Europe. More recently along with my partner Irene Glen, we have shown and bred German Shorthaired Pointers, including breeding the Bitch CC winner at Crufts in 2011 and 2012 and her granddaughter who won the CC at Crufts in 2022. Along with Irene, who is a partner in the Bessalone affix, I am showing Italian Spinone including the current breed record holder. I also have a great interest in the Terrier breeds, showing Border Terriers in the 1980's and 1990's and I am now actively showing the breed again.

My first judging appointment, at Open Show level, was in 1978 and I awarded my first set of CC's, in Cocker Spaniels in 1987. I have had the pleasure of judging Cockers both at Crufts and the

World Dog Show. I am now passed to award CC's in the UK to 24 breeds in the Gundog Group as well as judging the Group at Championship Show level. I also judge the Terrier Group at Championship Shows and have just been approved by the UK Kennel Club to judge BIS at Championship Show level.

My first ever overseas judging appointment was in Sweden, the Cocker Spaniel Club Show back in 1985. I have now judged in most countries in Europe as well as in Australia, New Zealand, South Africa and Pakistan.

This will be the fifth time I have had the pleasure to judge for the Ostra Club, the first time in 1991 at Skokloster Castle. I am really looking forward to judging in Sweden again, quality dogs and great hospitality.

Suzi Tagg – kennel Oiyou



I have owned Flatcoated Retrievers for over 30 years but only started to be interested in showing a few years later. I have thoroughly enjoyed learning about the Flatcoated Retriever and adore the breed and their characteristics. All my dogs have worked picking up birds on shoots as well as been shown. My affix is Oiyou and have now bred 3 litters, always keeping a puppy. My latest brood bitch is from the Black Brianta kennel in the Czech Republic.

During my learning process I was the Show Secretary of Hampshire Gundog Society and then became a Founder Member and Secretary of the Southern Flatcoated Retriever Club. This is a role that I have now been doing for 17 years.

I started judging in 2006 and am proud to award CC's in both

Flatcoated and Curly Coated Retrievers.

Following my previous appointment in Sweden being cancelled due to COVID, I am very much looking forward to this appointment.

I have owned by Golden Retrievers since 1974, and have been breeding under the affix of AMIRENE for the past 50 years. My first home bred Ch was Sh.Ch. Amirene King Eider of Davern owned by Charles and Brenda Lowe. All of my present day Amirene's can be traced back to him. Both he and his son, Sh.Ch. Ritzilyn Cockney Robin have been very influential on blood lines throughout the world. Another of his sons, Dual Ch Amirene Intrepid was very influential in Switzerland and throughout Europe, demonstrating true working ability as well as conformation and beauty.

Throughout the years I have been devoted to the breed, involved in showing, working, breeding and judging.
